The speaker was a Workwell auditor. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The new program is called Health & Safety Excellence and is replacing the safety groups. ○ If complete the program, will be entitled to a \$1,000 to \$50,000 rebate per element. Referenced 11 elements. ○ There is new information on the WSIB website. Data was available on Compass. ○ There is a Workwell app for phones. Also mentioned the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health & Safety (CCOHS) website. Now has an app where you can put in questions and receive a tips sheet for that subject matter. ○ Noise induced hearing loss kit. Developed by Health & Safety North. Is an app. Up to 1% accurate. ○ There are other tools you can use – small cube you hang in the area for 8 hours. Gives you a baseline and know where your spikes are. Know it will be over 85 decibels. ○ ACTION: KS to distribute presentation. • Aecon is moving from a “the worker is the problem” to a “the worker is the solution” philosophy based on the work of Todd Conklin.
